Let's help new families join the fun. This fall invite families to join us in the outdoors as we **#AdventureOn!** Here are a few things unit leaders should consider while preparing to welcome new members at a roundup night.

Be Prepared

- Contact your District Executive to schedule your roundup night.
- Plan some fun activities for the youth. Perhaps you can have scouts from a troop help with some activities.
- Have your Scouts wear their uniforms the night of the roundup.
- Make copies of your Pack or Troop calendar and contacts to distribute to new families.
- Communicate to your DE the leadership needs the unit has.
 - Are there any additional den leader, assistant scoutmaster or committee member positions needed?
 - Your DE will bring copies of the family skill survey form for the new adults to fill out.
 - Be ready to help provide instructions to a new volunteer about how to access Youth Protection Training and other position specific training.
 - Remember your district and council trainers are ready to meet with all your leaders to conduct YPT and certain other training.

Update your unit's BeAScout pin on <u>my.scouting.org</u>. The BeAScout pin allows families to find your unit on BeAScout.org. It can be activated and edited by a member of the unit's Key 3 (Charter Organization Representative, Committee Chair, and Cubmaster/Scoutmaster). Go to <u>www.scouting.org/resources/online-registration</u> to learn how to update your pin.

Update your unit's social media (facebook, instagram, etc.)

Go local with fliers, yard signs, and posters. The council has some yard signs and posters available, but you can also make your own. Get families involved. Word of mouth and personal invitations produce great results.

Contact the school from which you recruit about their Open House night. Many schools will host an open house before the first day of school for new families in the school. It is a great opportunity to let these families know that there is a scouting program in the neighborhood. Your DE can supply you with some flyers for the open house.

The success of your signup event is important to you, your unit leaders, and your unit. Let's work together and have a great fall recruitment.

Cub Scout Camping Policy Update

Effective August 1, 2024, the Cub Scout camping policies will be updated in the Guide to Safe Scouting. These changes were made to reflect the program updates that occurred on June 1, 2024. These changes include:

- Separation of policies for Webelos dens versus Arrow of Light den/patrols.
- Updated policies for Webelos den level camping.
 - For example, Webelos cannot attend camporees as day visitors or camp overnight with a Scouts BSA troop. But can absolutely still camp as a den following youth protection, GTSS policies, BALOO etc.
- Updated policies for Arrow of Light den/patrol camping.
 - For example, Arrow of Light den/patrols may now camp overnight at a camporee, and not just attend as day visitors.

These camping policy changes do not reflect any changes to the Barriers to Abuse or other youth protection policies indicated in the Guide to Safe Scouting. Please review these policy updates and share with Cub Scout leadership in your council. These policy updates will be included in the forthcoming updated BALOO training syllabus.

There are four ways to succeed with your popcorn sale. The more methods you use, the better results you'll have.



- 1. Show-n-Sell: Order popcorn early. When the sale begins on September 1st, your unit sells popcorn to customers at a pre-determined location, such as a supermarket, big box store, or a festival. Units that have used this method report great success.
- 2. Show and Deliver: Scouts visit friends and neighbors with the product and a 'Take Order' form. They can sell the popcorn on hand or take an order, whatever the customer prefers.
- 3. Take Order: Scouts visit friends, family, and neighbors with the Order Form and take orders that will be delivered later.
- 4. Online Direct Sale: Friends and family purchase popcorn online and use a special code number the scout supplies. Camp Masters ships the popcorn directly to the customer. Shipping is free. Profit from the online sale is then forwarded to the scout's unit.

Training Corner

<u>Cub Scout Position Specific Training Modules are</u> <u>updated on My.Scouting</u>

The online position-specific training modules for Den Leader/Assistant Den Leader, Cubmaster/Assistant Cubmaster, and Pack Committee Members were updated on May 30 to reflect the program updates launched on June 1, 2024.

The outline of the training modules has not changed. There are still four different position Learning Plans; Den Leader/Assistant Den Leader, Cubmaster/Assistant Cubmaster, Pack Committee Chair, and Pack Committee Members. The run time for the modules has not been significantly changed. The names of the individual modules are still the same and so is the order that they are presented.

Cub Scout volunteers who completed training before these updates, do not have to retake training. We do strongly encourage Cub Scout volunteers to retake key modules with the most edits based on the program updates.

Woodbadge

Buckskin Council will offer a Woodbadge course in September, 2025.

Wood Badge is an advanced, national leadership course open only to Scouting volunteers and professionals.

Scouters from Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouts, and Explorers, and district and council Scouters all are welcome and belong here. *The purpose of Wood Badge is to develop skilled leaders who can strengthen Scouting units in achieving the mission of the Boy Scouts of America.*

When we accomplish the mission of Scouting, we do it in the units.

Although the course is different today, what Baden-Powell said in 1919 still applies: "One of the purposes of Wood Badge training is to get Scouters to think about the practice of Scouting, to meet together, to exchange experiences, and to live together in the spirit of the Scout Oath."

Completion of this course is mandatory for a MINI-MUM OF ONE adult on a Pack overnighter.

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



Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation September 20-21, 2024 — Camp Arrowhead

INTRODUCTION TO OUTDOOR LEADER SKILLS

SEPTEMBER 20-21, 2024 - CAMP ARROWHEAD

What is IOLS? The Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Positions-Specific Training and Venturing Advisor Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the confidence to take youth into the outdoors.

- Gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a boy-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead scouts in the out-of-doors. In addition, the teaching methods, activities, and games model the variety of teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs.
- ➤ Hands-on participation is the best learning tool, and this course models the techniques used by effective Scoutmasters, and other leaders in the Scouting program. Attendees will see and experience different aspects of how Scouting works while playing the role of Scouts in a troop.
- Participants will leave the training experience with a full understanding of how the patrol method operates, a feeling of comfort in working with the instructing their Scouts, and an increased level of confidence taking Scouts outdoors safely.

What is covered in IOLS? The course is designed to address a wide variety of topics such as Outdoor Ethics, Cooking, Fire Site Preparation & Building, Campfire Program, Interfaith Worship, Flag Ceremony and more.

What is the cost to attend? The course is <u>\$30.00 per person</u>. This covers course material, cracker barrel on Friday night, along with breakfast and lunch on Saturday.
