# EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS EXPERIENCE CAMPOREE AND CUB SCOUT FAMILY CAMP

Buckskin Council, WVU Medicine Thomas Hospitals, and the Summit Bechtel Reserve are hosting a Emergency Preparedness Experience Weekend on October 4-6.

What great activities are planned? In addition to many displays and demonstrations by state and local first responders, a ton of activities will be offered in the afternoon for packs, troops and crews. Do you like fishing, range and target sports, RC planes, field games? This is the weekend for you!

The activity day on Saturday, Oct 5 is free. Packs will have a special area for overnight camping Friday and Saturday nights. Troops and crews will have a separate camping area as well.

What does it cost? The full weekend of camping at the Cub Family Camp or Troop / Crew Camporee is \$20 per person.

This includes all activities and three meals on Saturday

OR

If you plan to just visit for the day, the event is FREE. (Lunch is included, but no breakfast or dinner.)

For an additional fee of \$10, Scouts and leaders can do Climbing and ziplining or Cub Scouts can do Climbing.

### Fall Popcorn Sale 2024 Begins September 1st!

One fundraiser to support your unit's entire year of fun and adventure! Popcorn is here to help you fund a fantastic Scouting program in the coming year. With the support of Buckskin Council and CAMP MASTERS, you can earn all the necessary funding through this single activity.

There are four ways to succeed with your popcorn sale. The more methods you use, the better results you'll have.

- **1. Show-n-Sell:** Order popcorn early. When the sale begins on September 1st, your unit sells popcorn to customers at a pre-determined location, such as a supermarket, big box store, or a festival. Units that have used this method report great success.
- **2. Show and Deliver:** Scouts visit friends and neighbors with the product and a 'Take Order' form. They can sell the popcorn on hand or take an order, whatever the customer prefers.
- **3. Take Order:** Scouts visit friends, family, and neighbors with the Order Form and take orders that will be delivered later.
- **4. Online Direct Sale:** Friends and family purchase popcorn online and use a special code number the scout supplies. Camp Masters ships the popcorn directly to the customer. Shipping is free. Profit from the online sale is then forwarded to the scout's unit.

### 2026 NATIONAL SCOUT JAMBOREE DATES ANNOUNCED

The Boy Scouts of America announced that the next National Scout Jamboree will

be held at the Summit Bechtel Reserve in West Virginia July 22-31, 2026. More than just a gathering of Scouts, the Jamboree will provide High Adventure programming, a chance to meet Scouts from around the country, and so much more. Many of you have waited years for the opportunity to attend a Jamboree, and we are excited to offer a local contingent that will help you reach this Scouting milestone. We hope that you will consider joining with us as we plan and take part in a memorable Scouting adventure! Preliminary plans for the 2026 NSJ include the Buckskin Council sending a male troop of 40 (36 youth and 4 adults) and a female troop of 20 (18 youth and 2 adults).

The event-wide arena shows will be returning during the 2026 NSJ. The Jamboree will also incorporate the 250th birth-day of the USA. National Jamboree plans to open registration in November, 2024.

Due to the recent announcement of the Jamboree dates, we will wait until further event details are published prior to outlining contingent costs and a registration timeline. Check out the next steps listed below in order to stay in the loop on Jamboree and contingent developments.

### **Training Corner**

### **Cub Scout Leader Training**

Online Cub Scout leader training has been updated and reflects changes to the new Cub Scout program that was launched on June 1, 2024. We strongly suggest anyone who has previously completed this training to complete the updated online modules, this will ensure they are prepared to conduct the new Cub Scout program.

## Which sections on the online Cub Scout training site have been updated?

Online Cub Scout position-specific training is conveniently broken into modules that you can take at the time of your choosing. You do not have to take every module of any particular training in the same session.

(All Cub Scout online training can be found under the "My Training" section of my.Scouting.org.)

All of the training modules have been updated to ensure they reflect the current program. Here are the online position-specific trainings that contain modules that have the most significant updates:

- → Den Leader/Assistant Den Leader
- ★ Cubmaster/Assistant Cubmaster
- Pack Committee Chair
- ✦ Pack Committee Members

If you hold one of these positions and it's been a while since you reviewed the online training, it might be a good idea to retake these entire trainings. However, if you're short on time and are looking to get up to speed right away, there are certain modules you can take first.

### Which modules should I really focus on?

The National Cub Scouting Committee recommends that — at a minimum — you review the following modules:

- **✦ Bobcat:** Bobcat is now a Cub Scout Adventure required for all ranks.
- **★** Advancement: Updates how each badge of rank is earned.
- **← Cub Scout Uniforms:** Includes information on Webelos and Arrow of Light uniform updates.
- **←** Conducting a Den Meeting: Outlines how to plan and conduct a den meeting using the updated Adventures and Den Meeting Resources found in the handbooks and online.
- → Denners and Den Chiefs: Recommended for den leaders for Bears, Webelos and Arrow of Light dens. The updated Bobcat requirement for these ranks includes the Denner and Arrow of Light Patrol Leader.
- **←** Conducting a Pack Meeting: Includes information on planning for Cub Scout Adventures that can be completed as a pack and making pack meetings more activity based.
- **✦ Pack Structure:** Includes updated information about forming dens.
- → Annual Program Planning: Update includes planning for Cub Scout Adventures that can be completed as a pack. The average time it will take to refresh your training is 30 minutes, give or take a few minutes depending on what position you hold.

### Woodbadge

Buckskin Council will offer a Woodbadge course in September, 2025.

Wood Badge is an advanced, national leadership course open only to Scouting volunteers and professionals.

Scouters from Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouts, and Explorers, and district and council Scouters all are welcome and belong here. The purpose of Wood Badge is to develop skilled leaders who can strengthen Scouting units in achieving the mission of the Boy Scouts of America.

When we accomplish the mission of Scouting, we do it in the units.

Although the course is different today, what Baden-Powell said in 1919 still applies: "One of the purposes of Wood Badge training is to get Scouters to think about the practice of Scouting, to meet together, to exchange experiences, and to live together in the spirit of the Scout Oath."

They have a payment system integrated now so units don't have to set up a payment processing account to take credit cards at Show 'n Sell and Take order.

There are four ways to succeed with your popcorn sale. The more methods you use, the better results you'll have.

- 1. Show-n-Sell: Order popcorn early. When the sale begins on September 1st, your unit sells popcorn to customers at a predetermined location, such as a supermarket, big box store, or a festival. Units that have used this method report great success.
- 2. Show and Deliver: Scouts visit friends and neighbors with the the decision to join. product and a 'Take Order' form. They can sell the popcorn on hand or take an order, whatever the customer prefers.
- 3. Take Order: Scouts visit friends, family, and neighbors with the Order Form and take orders that will be delivered later.
- 4. Online Direct Sale: Friends and family purchase popcorn online and use a special code number the scout supplies. Camp Masters ships the popcorn directly to the customer. Shipping is free. Profit from the online sale is then forwarded to the scout's unit.

How do you get started? The first step is completing the 2024 Popcorn Commitment Form. Find it in the appendix of this edition of the Courier or online at www.buckskin.org/popcorn. Training will be offered at your District Kickoff.




